

I have a growing excitement for the upcoming Relational Evangelism Seminar

with Julie-anne Laird on Saturday, 22nd Feb (see notice on front page). Growing in confidence and skill in sharing what Jesus means to us is one of the goals to come out of our Wayfinding Day in November.

Robin and I, along with Emily and Greg, heard Julie-anne's seminar at the diocesan Leadership Camp last July and really got a lot out of it.

Many of you, like me, may have experienced an inspiring talk but then never got around to putting the things learned into practice. This could easily happen in February if we don't have a way of embedding and practicing the principles we learn.

Thankfully, Julie-anne's team have developed a mechanism to assist this process. It is called *The Ripple Effect Course.* Vestry agreed we should offer

this course to the parish this year. Everyone in the parish is invited to join.

The course consists of 4 Modules of 8 sessions each. We will do 1 module per term. The first Module to begin the week of February 24th.

The Ripple Effect Course is designed to be done in small groups. As another of our 2025 goals is to increase our number of small groups, this course can facilitate this process as well.

By the end of next week you will each receive a letter either by email or post with more details about the course and its topics and how I envision it playing out logistically over this year. I will also be asking for some feedback regarding interest and what times would work for you.

#### **HOW'S IT GOING?**

Would we have reacted any differently?

The Passover Festival in Jerusalem had ended the day before. The next morning thousands upon thousands of pilgrims would have packed up and headed back to their homes travelling in large groups for safety against robbers, wild animals, and the elements.

Mary and Joseph had set off with their entourage assuming Jesus, now 12 years old and on the cusp of manhood, was somewhere in the group.

But he wasn't.

At the end of the first day's walk back towards Nazareth, Mary and Joseph discovered Jesus was not there and they panicked.

The next day they rush back to Jerusalem and looked and looked, but could not find him. Their worry increased.

Then, after three days, they discover Jesus in the Temple engaged in conversation with the teachers of the Scriptures.

Mary and Joseph rush to him in both relief and amazement. Mary says, "Son, why have you done this to us? Your father and I have been very worried, and we've been searching for you!"

But Jesus is gobsmacked and with no hint of insolence replied, "Why did you have to look for me? Didn't you know that I would be in my Father's

#### house/doing my Father's work?"

Jesus assumed Mary and Joseph understood who he was and that it was the most natural thing in the world for him to be in his Father's house. But they did not understand.

Jesus is both 100% human and 100% God. Now that is hard for us to get our heads around. It would have been the same for Mary and Joseph.

Jesus at 12 was growing in his intimacy with his heavenly Father and as such growing in his understanding of who he is and what he is to be doing.

After this incident, Jesus returns to Nazareth with Mary and Joseph and continues to mature. He is obedient to his earthly parents and waits for the right time to start his public ministry.

So what is the message for us?

When we put our faith in Jesus Christ, we are adopted into God's family and God becomes our Father. Just like with Jesus, God desires us to join him in his work in the world.

One of the goals for this year that came out of our Wayfinding Day last November was to discover what God is up to in our community and join with him in it. Robyn White will be leading our journey of discovery over the next few months. Please pray that we will see where God is working and that our parish will wholeheartedly join in.
