





Happiness comes from the word happenstance which means circumstance. So, when my circumstances are everything as I want them to be, I am happy. There is nothing wrong with being happy, but it is not the same as joy.

Rick Warren writes, "Joy is the settled assurance that God is in control of my life, the quiet confidence that ultimately everything is going to be alright, and the determined choice to praise God in every situation."

This means I can be joyful, even when tears are streaming down my face. Joy is one of the fruits of the Spirit and is not dependent on our circumstances; joy is dependent on staying near to God, recognizing his presence with us in spite of the circumstances.

One of Jesus' titles is *Emmanuel* which means *God with us* and when we know that God is with us, we can have joy just like Paul & Silas singing in the Philippian jail; just like the fetus of John the Baptist leaping for joy when Mary, carrying Jesus in her womb came near.
