# HOW'S IT GOING?

John's gospel frequently has illustrations that have double meanings. John picks out some of Jesus' miracles in particular to illustrate key teachings about who Jesus is, and the changes He brings.

When Jesus turned the water into wine at the wedding at Cana, He used the six water iars used for ceremonial cleansing. These were reserved for the washing away of sin, similar to the daily sacrifices of lambs. Both the water cleansing and the lamb sacrifices were temporary arrangements. Something permanent was needed. Jesus' death on the cross was the big change coming.

When Jesus miraculously changed all the water into wine, He was showing that He was also changing the way sin was being dealt with permanently. That was his forthcoming death on the cross. This was emphasised again at the Last Supper when Jesus said that the wine was a sign of His blood on the cross, the New Covenant, the forgiveness of sin.

Another point John observed was the way Mary instructed the servants to do whatever Jesus told them to do. What seemed ridiculous turned out to be miraculous. It was a miraculous sign! It is also a clear statement for us to obey whatever Jesus asks us to do, whether it seems too hard or impossible. Discipleship seemingly involves courageous obedience to the teaching of Jesus and the leading of the Holy Spirit.
