

## **HOW'S IT GOING?**

Last Sunday we held our annual Healing Service on the Sunday close to St Luke's Day.

One of the facets of the time is asking if anyone has received an impression, vision or word from the Lord about what area of healing He particularly wished to heal. We received about six specific words. We know that least three of them were VERY accurate.

When we studied the passage from James Ch 5, we saw that the sick were encouraged to go to the elders of the church to receive prayer. It is was interesting to note that it was the church leaders and not specifically someone with a strong gift of healing.

We also noticed that they were to pray AND anoint with olive oil. In those days olive oil was one of the medical methods of bringing healing. This reminded us that prayer and medical assistance go closely together.

The other passage was in Mark Ch 9 where Jesus was asked to heal a boy who suffered serious health issues that were brought about by a demon. The father, in reply to a question from Jesus, said "I do have faith, but not enough. Help me to have more faith."

Faith is almost always involved in praying for healing. Either the person coming for healing needs to believe Jesus will heal, or the one praying needs faith. Best is if BOTH have faith!
