Marge Writes

Eschatology. How's that for a big word. I wonder if it has ever been used in Scrabble? It comes

from a Greek word meaning "last". It is used by Christians to refer to that time when the Kingdom of God (rule and reign of God) is completely established and fully present on earth and everything is rightly restored. A beautiful picture of this is found in Revelation 21 and Isaiah 25 where pain, suffering, tears, and death are no more.

The Kingdom of God on earth was begun in the life, death, resurrection and ascension of Jesus as evidenced by his works of healing, bringing back of the dead to life, and power over nature. The sending of the Holy Spirit to Jesus' followers makes it possible for God's Kingdom to continue to grow. God's Kingdom is here now, but it will not be fully realized until Jesus returns.

There is a line of thinking that assumes that because of the prolific healings of Jesus and the healing promises in Scriptures that God wants and is willing

to heal the sick **right now**. This is an "over-realized eschatology".

This is an interesting phrase that I came across this week in my personal study written by Paul Khosla. It refers to "an over-realized sense of God's Kingdom here on earth" when we try and force God's promises and their fulfilment into realization instead of living in the tension between God's promises and their fulfilment.

Now Paul Khosla, like me, totally believes that God heals today and prays in confidence for the healing of others. But, also, like me accepts the sovereignty of God.

I also believe that death is also a means of God's healing.

I also trust God to do the kind of healing He knows is best for someone in the moment trusting that the day of complete healing will come either in this life or the next.

I guess I feel the need to write on this topic because of the news we received about Craig Bruce (see next page). The news that Craig is now in palliative care does not mean Robin & I won't continue to pray for his healing, but, as his pastors Robin and I must also walk with him towards the possibility of death.

At the start of our Gospel reading last week Jesus warns his listeners of the egotistical and greedy ways of religious leaders of his day. They loved to show off their "piety", but exploited the poor widows.

The reading continued with Jesus watching as people gave their gifts at the Temple's offering box. The rich gave large amounts of money, but had plenty left over. The poor widow puts in only two small coins and shuffles away knowing she now had nothing left to live on.

Jesus is amazed at the generosity of the widow, for she gave all she had not merely out of her surplus.

- +Steve made three points about this story last weekend as he compared the giving of the rich with the giving of the poor widow:
- Mindset—difference between selfreliance and dependence on God.
- Measure of success—in God's eyes it is not the amount given, but what's left (costly)
- Motivation—do we give for God's approval or people's applause

God invites us to live out a radical selfgiving, whole-hearted faith in the footsteps of Jesus offering our talents, time and treasure to the glory of God.
