RIPPLE EFFECT WEEK 4 SUMMARY

Theme: Fall and Brokenness

Key Point: Acknowledging our brokenness. Our sin damages ourselves, others and the world God made.

Key Encouragement:: God works through your weakness, brokenness, and even your sin.

Scripture: Genesis 3, Matt 27:45-46, 1 John 1:5-2:2

Summary: People trusted themselves instead of God. Being 'in the image of God' was not enough, they wanted to be God, and so they rebelled against Him. God judged Adam and Eve and we now live in a world that is profoundly broken, marred by sin and death. Rejecting the good and just God who gives life can only lead to death. Putting ourselves first must lead to broken relationships with each other and our world. We are out of sync with God, each other, the world, and even ourselves. The impact of human sinfulness ripples out across all people, in all generations.

Jesus came into our broken world and took on Himself the judgement our sin deserved when He died on the cross. As we believe this and confess our sins, we are forgiven.

Questions:

- How has my sinfulness contributed to the world's brokenness?
- How does recognizing my own brokenness affect the way I treat other broken people?
- How does knowing the world is 'not what it is meant to be' help me respond to frustration, pain or disappointment?
